Petitions, Requests and Communications

City Recycling – Devin VanHouse, owner of D&D Services dba John's Sanitary, reviewed recycling within the City. John's Sanitary is now picking up recycling on Wednesday's, which is the same day as garbage pick-up. All of the recycling is co-mingled at this time.

Steve and Devin VanHouse discussed working with an outside company and making improvements to the business to make John's Sanitary more environmentally conscientious.

Resolution 2019 - #23 - Easement – The resolution is for a 10-foot permanent easement at Lot 20, Block 3, Silver Bay First Addition that is needed to install a new water main for the Water Main Looping project. The easement has been drafted by the City Attorney and property owners are in agreement with the terms of \$2,500, the removal of a tree on the boulevard, and the planting of a new tree. City Engineers have reviewed and determined the cost is reasonable. Motion Goutermont, second Perfetto to adopt the Easement Resolution 2019 - #23.

Resolution 2019 - #24 - Contract award for Water Looping Project - The resolution is authorizing the award of contract to Utilities Systems of America, Inc. for the Water Main Looping project. Joe Rhein discussed the lowest cost and responsible bidders public bid amount of \$167,387.50, which is lower than the engineering estimates. City Administrator reports funds will used from reserves so there are no intended increases in water rates as a result of the project. City Engineers reviewed the bid and are recommending award on the condition of the approval of the easement. Motion Perfetto, second Goutermont to adopt the Contract award for Water Looping Project Resolution 2019 - #24 on the condition of the approval of the easement.

Sanitary Sewer Improvements (Sewer Bridges and Trunk Line) – Joe Rhein from Bolton and Menk discussed updated plans on the Sanitary Sewer Bridges and the Trunk Line project (Sewer Bridges and Trunk Line). The advertising for bids will be published in the City official newspaper, the Duluth newspaper, and trade publications with a bid date of May 21st at 2:00 p.m. Construction to begin July 2019 with completion being mid to late September 2019. The City has been awarded a \$250,000 grant from IRRRB for the project with the remaining funds coming from cash reserves and a local loan. Rhein is recommending the approval of the plans and specifications discussed, advertising for public bids, and the date and time for the bid opening. Motion Goutermont, second Perfetto to accept the plans and specifications, the advertising schedule, and bid opening date. MOTION CARRIED.
