Acting Mayor DeRosier called the public hearing to order at 7:00 p.m.

Acting Mayor DeRosier described the purpose for the hearing is to obtain comments regarding the Proposed City Code Chapter 5, Nuisances and Offenses, Section 590, Regulation of Recreational Vehicles which is intended to curb long term use but allows for visitors to stay in for short period of time.

Acting Mayor DeRosier explained that the Council will open the hearing up for public comments, take comments, and then adjourn the Public Hearing. The Regular meeting will immediately follow the Public Hearing at which time the City Council will accept, deny, or table the adoption of the City Code Chapter 5, Nuisances and Offenses.

Acting Mayor DeRosier explained that there will be some exceptions during events such as Bay Days when RV's are allowed to park behind ReUnion Hall and other public areas.

Ray Parker stated RV's parked by the curling club are an eyesore and asked if RV owners are charged to park there. Member FitzGerald stated the area is used for winter storage and a fee is charged.

Acting Mayor DeRosier asked again for public comments. There were none.

Acting Mayor DeRosier called for a final time any other comments. Hearing none he requested a motion to close the Public Hearing.
