**Treasurer's Report- March 2025** 

**License Agreement Amendment- 148<sup>th</sup> Fighter Wing Training-** The 148<sup>th</sup> Fighter Wing was unable to perform their training on July 10<sup>th</sup> and have rescheduled for August 12<sup>th</sup>.

**Water/Wastewater Operating Hiring-** Personnel Committee is recommending the hiring of Lief Maxwell and Brandon Lubich as Water/Wastewater Operators at 80% of the full time wage, 90% after 6-months, and full wage rate at 1-year pending they have obtained their Class D Licensures. 90% probationary wage would continue until license is obtained, pending successful completion of background checks and pre-employment physicals. Starting date to be determined.

**Part-Time Bartender Hiring-** The Liquor Store Manager is recommending the hiring of Margaret Gustafson as a Part-Time Bartender, starting at 80% of the PT Bartender wage, pending successful completion of the background check. Starting date to be determined.

**Boathouse Bay Draw Request-** TIF Draw #8 in the amount of \$262,703.36 plus IRRRB grant of \$126,627.54 to cover Northland Constructors invoice #7 in the amount of \$389,330.90.

**MN Power Trailhead-** MN power has scheduled to install 3-way transformer and move poles that are required for the Trailhead Center to proceed, a check was issued on July 17, 2025 for #34,178.00. These costs are part of the construction budget.

**Multi-Modal Trailhead Ground Breaking Ceremony- August 4<sup>th</sup>-** Ground breaking ceremony will be August 4<sup>th</sup> at 10:00 a.m. at the site.

## Petitions, Requests, and Communications -

**Public Comments-** Judy Carlson expressed her frustration regarding the perimeter ditching and flooding issue, she feels nothing has been done to remedy the situation and would like the Council to work with Lake County and solve the problems. Randy Carlson expressed that he felt some of the problem was with the structures that are built above Adams. Mayor LeBlanc stated he would contact Member Bautch, who has been meeting with all the residents along Adams Blvd and set up a meeting for concerned residents and County Commissioners.

**Mayor/Council Communication-** Mayor LeBlanc thanked all the volunteers who plan events in Silver Bay and the area, such as Bay Days, Finland Wooden Bat Tournament, Hockey Camp, ATV Rally, Salmon Classic, etc. and appreciates those who participate in the events.

**Resolution 2025-#25A Amendment to Special Assessment Policy-** Josh Stier presented an amendment to the Special Assessment Policy based on public input received and to better clarify the policy. Changes include clarification to definitions, interest rate, how corner lots are assessed, deferment for those who are senior citizens, disabled, or military, and the development of an ERU for Non-profit/churches/other non-residential properties. Motion by DeRosier, second FitzGerald to adopt Resolution 2025-#25A Amendment to Special Assessment Policy. MOTION CARRIED.

Resolution 2025-#50 Final Assessment Roll for CSAH-32 Project- Josh Stier presented the final assessment roll for the CSAH-32 project. Noted changes include lower ERU value for non-profits/churches/non-residential properties which impact St. Mary's Church and Northshore Area Partners, removal of Sychar Lutheran Church due to address and utility services coming from Edison Blvd, amendment to the time to pay the assessment to the City of Silver Bay, with no interest. It was noted that property owners being assessed would have until November 15<sup>th</sup> to pay their assessment with no interest to the City, but no payments will be received by the City between November 16<sup>th</sup> and December 31<sup>st</sup> while the assessment certification process is completed. Once the assessment is certified to the County, payment is made with interest for the year to the County. Discussion on using water services for when a property would be assessed, if not by address, to minimize confusion and better clarify when a corner property would be assessed to help with clarifying for one assessment. Motion by Hoff, second FitzGerald to adopt Resolution 2025-#52 Final Assessment Roll for CSAH-32 Project. MOTION CARRIED.

**Resolution 2025-#22A MN Power License Agreement-** The agreement had been previously approved by Council. MN Public Utilities Commission has approved the agreement. The franchise fee, which has not been charged since January 2025, will begin the updated fee of \$5/month per meter for Residents and Businesses beginning September 1, 2025. Motion by DeRosier, second FitzGerald to adopt Resolution 2025-#22A MN Power License Agreement. MOTION CARRIED.

There will be no cost to the city for construction, installation, operation, repairs, or maintenance. City Attorney has reviewed the agreement. Discussion regarding location and number of charging units. Motion by Hoff, second DeRosier to adopt Resolution 2025-#51 License Agreement to MN Power for Charging Stations at the Multi-Modal Trailhead Center. MOTION CARRIED.
